




# EPISODE 04 TOKO AND THE SCHOOL FESTIVAL

### **PREVIOUS EPISODE**


















































## Cultural festival / School festival

Most Japanese high schools annually conduct a "cultural festival". This is also called a "school festival", and it is the biggest event that takes place regularly at most schools.

Many school festivals have names which have been handed down from generation to generation. Four high schools in Tajimi hold festivals with distinct names.

It is also common in Japan for festivals to take place in elementary schools, junior high schools, universities, communities and various organizations.

## High Schools in Tajimi

In Tajimi high schools, the new school year starts in April. The summer vacation lasts about a month from the end of July to the end of August. During that time, club activities and make-up lessons are planned, and many students come to school. Students prepare for the school festival during the summer break. Classes or teams that perform in the festival need a lot of time to prepare.

High schools in Tajimi carry out school festivals over two days in September, just after the summer vacation, or in October. Depending on the school, there are activities that show their uniqueness through students or guardians' participation. Some schools open their festival to the public while others perform have private festivals.

### Oribe Gakuen High School's "Origakusai"

In the fictional high school where the characters in "Yakunara Mug Cup Mo" study, the school festival is called as "Origakusai", and it is open to the public. They participate in the class program in turns and sell pottery on site. They must spend a lot of time preparing the festival's theme, and plan so that everybody has a good time. On the day of the school festival, they also enjoy mingling with other students, teachers and people from the local community.

## Significance of School Festivals

A school festivals is a full-participation type of event. It is held in accordance with aims endorsed by the Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology; these are formation of human relations, affiliation with others, deepening solidarity, fostering community-mindedness, and the general advancement of a healthy school life. A festival is also designed to promote the schools' own policy, aim and theme for the year.

### Program by a class, a team or club

In school festivals, stalls and performances are run by classes, teams, clubs and the organizations that students belong to. Each student has a certain role and they work together to perform original plays, create large works of art, realize theme parks, and play concerts. They learn how to cooperate, strengthen solidarity, carry out their assignments and feel a sense of achievement through the school festival.

A "class" is a type of affiliation. Students work together toward a common purpose. But unlike club activities which have a predetermined course, in festivals the students form a bond of solidarity. They might design a class t-shirt, and in such activities you can see the product of their cooperation.
